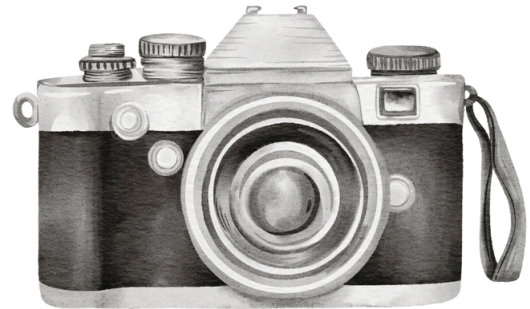
Primary sources included:
